Resolution AGAINST the California "Safe, Clean and Reliable Drinking Water Supply Act of 2010"

Resolution 2010-01

WHEREAS the "Safe, Clean and Reliable Drinking Water Supply Act of 2010" (the "Proposition"), also known as SB-2 introduced by Senator Cogdill of the Central Valley, is proposed as a proposition on the November 2010 state-wide California ballot; and

WHEREAS the Proposition facilitates increased diversion of water from Northern California, thereby impacting jobs availability and the economy of our region for the benefit of the Central Valley and Southern California; and

WHEREAS proper environmental studies have not been performed for the majority of projects proposed in the Proposition, thereby not proving the proposed projects are safe for all Californians; and

WHEREAS the State of California remains in an economic crisis, particularly since the State borrowed from special districts such as ours, the State has furloughed and layed off workers, and the State has failed to meet the needs of education; and

WHEREAS the Proposition is virtually incomprehensible with far too much scope, poor definition of projects and complexity; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Trinity Center Community Services District Board of Directors does not support the Proposition; and

RESOLVED, That any measure that proposes to use water diverted from the Trinity River watershed should undergo environmental review before funding for project implementations is put before the voters; and

RESOLVED, That the State should undertake no new debt measures, particularly measures on the order of billions of dollars, until such time as the state has a balanced budget with a budget surplus; and

RESOLVED, That the projects in the Proposition should be proposed in multiple measures that enable voters to grasp the scope of the costs and environmental impacts involved; and

RESOLVED That District voters are urged to vote against the "Safe, Clean and Reliable Drinking Water Supply Act of 2010".
